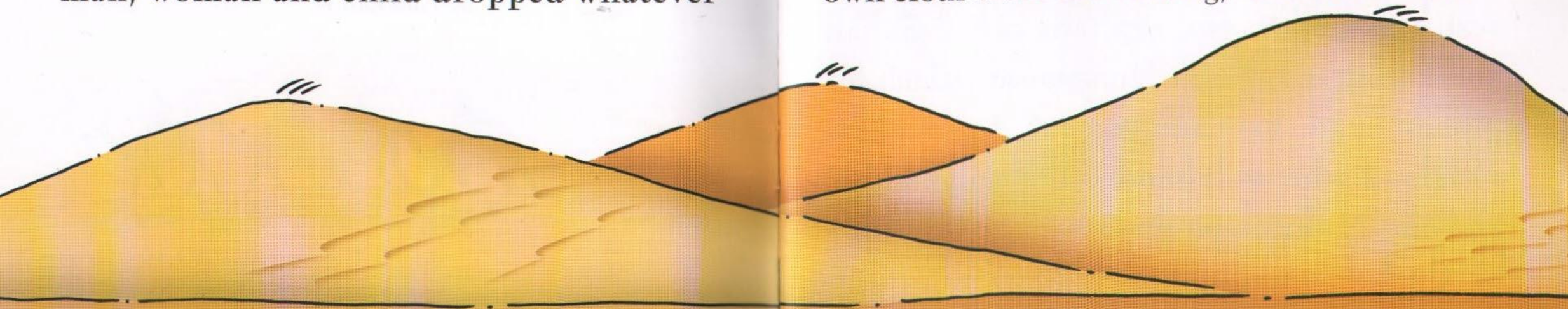
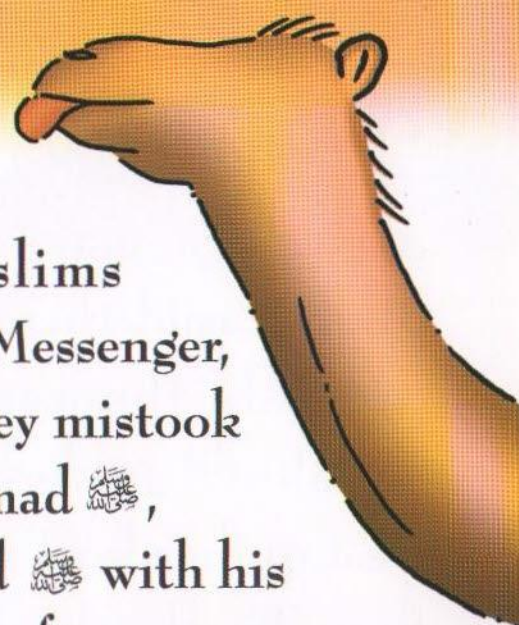
"O! you Arabs, here comes the Prophet you have all been waiting for," shouted a man from the tribe of Bani Israel.
