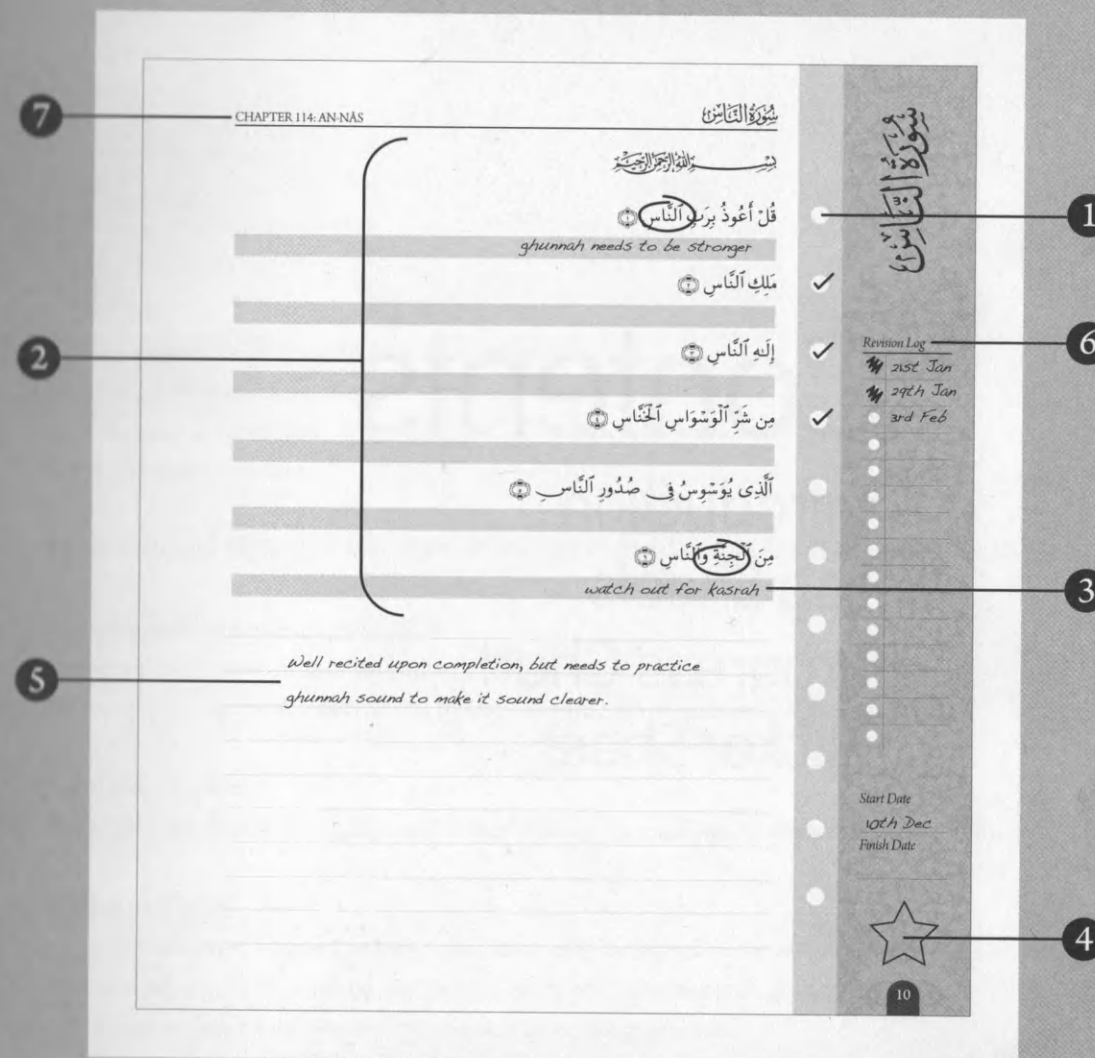

Enjoyable, Accurate and Faster Memorisation

That's what you will experience when using the hifdh logbook with your child! This unique resource is designed to significantly enhance Quran memorisation, and here's how:

- 1 That Which is Measured, Improves**
Just the mere fact that your child's memorisation is being charted and measured, is enough to lead to improved progress. In the absence of such measurement, progress is not recorded, and so achievement is difficult to determine. If achievement is vague or unknown, it loses its motivational property. The hifdh logbook overcomes this problem as part of its core design, offering a clear platform for measuring progress in Quran memorisation.
- 2 Visual Record**
Children typically memorise before they learn to read. Unlike those who memorise by reading the Quran, children who learn by listening do not have a physical visual record of their progress. In fact, many children who memorise by reading also do not use the *mus-haf* to record their memorisation. The hifdh logbook provides the perfect visual record of memorisation, showing the script of the *mus-haf* in a layout designed for marking progress. A separate progress chart is also included at the back of the book.
- 3 Accuracy**
Memorisation is not just about quantity. Quality matters, and the hifdh logbook offers an inviting layout for annotation and notes. Whilst some parents and children may be reluctant to annotate their *mus-haf*, the hifdh logbook is the ideal place to circle or highlight parts of Quranic script or write small notes on tajweed. The ability to personalise your memorisation record with your notes that are particular to your child, leads to efficient progress tracking and faster, more accurate memorisation.





Developing Good Practice

There are a number of recommended practices to get the best out of the time spent memorising the Noble Quran. Sincerity is the first and most essential ingredient, followed by learning under a well versed teacher who is able to correct your child's recitation. The hifdh logbook is an excellent resource for teachers and parents to monitor and record child progress as well as note their mistakes and corrections. It is good to have a set time and place for memorisation, with the early dawn being the most recommended time. It is also important to stick to a daily limit so that progress is steady, measured and planned.

A Motivation

The hifdh logbook is a motivation to memorise in and of itself. But if that wasn't enough, it also includes a sticker reward system offering an irresistible drive for children. Quranic verses and ahadeeth of the Messenger of Allah ﷺ are found throughout the book, connecting the hearts to true purpose and virtues of Quran memorisation. The hifdh logbook therefore combines between both intrinsic and extrinsic motivations leaving your child no excuse but to press ahead with this noble deed!

In Sync with the Way Your Child Memorises

Children memorise in a host of different ways. Some by listening, some by reading, some by writing and some by a combination of these ways. There is one thing however that is common to all methods: revision. The hifdh logbook realises that committing a chapter to memory is just the first step, and that successful memorisation is built upon repeated revision. A revision chart is built into design of each chapter log, making it easy for you to track your child's revision and keep their memorisation in check.

After Juzz Amm

You may be wondering why the hifdh logbook only covers the last *juzz* of the Noble Quran. The answer is simple. By the time most children have completed memorisation of *Juzz Amma*, they are able to read the Quran independently, and their personal *mus-haf* is the best place for them to mark and note their progress and past mistakes in memorisation. The hifdh logbook is a stepping stone, and is not designed to detract from essential need for your child to build a special bond with their *mus-haf*.

When beginning to memorise the Quran, children don't just cover the last *juzz*, but often learn other verses too. The hifdh logbook offers a few of the most common selections as well as some blank log sheets at the end of the book, making it easy to monitor all your child's memorisation in one place.
